Julie Goodnight and Anne Brzezicki are September's Guests for the Certified Horsemanship Association on Horses in the Morning Radio Show

(September 2015) – Each month, CHA has two featured guests on the Horses in the Morning Radio Show on the third Tuesday of the month. The September show will discuss Exercises for Advanced Riders with our two featured guests—Julie Goodnight of Horse Master TV and Anne Brzezicki with Middle Tennessee State University. CHA's CEO Christy Landwehr and show host Glenn the Geek will talk with these two horse women on air on Tuesday, September 15, at 9 a.m. Eastern Time. Listeners can listen live or to a recorded audio file on iTunes, HorsesintheMorning.com, or through the Horse Radio Network mobile phone app.

Goodnight has now been the host of RFD-TV's Horse Master TV for several years now, and her insight and wisdom into horsemanship training delights riders of all disciplines every Monday and Saturday night when the show airs. Goodnight is no stranger to traveling as she helps riders all over the U.S. using her "Classic Skills for a Natural Ride." Whether they ride English, Western, dressage, or just trail ride, Goodnight's instruction instills confidence in the saddle while she explains the "whys" of horsemanship and her insights into equine behavior. Goodnight helps riders interact with their horses better. She has experience in the disciplines of dressage, jumping, reining, cow horse, racing, wilderness riding, and colt starting. She is published in *Horse & Rider*, *The Trail Rider*, and other publications. Goodnight is honored to be the International Spokesperson for the Certified Horsemanship Association and was named Equine Affaire's Exceptional Equestrian Educator. Despite growing up on the Florida hunter-jumper circuits, Goodnight has settled in the mountains of Colorado with her husband, Rich Moorhead. Both love versatility ranch horse competitions and riding cow horses.

As the MTSU Director of the Equestrian Program, Brzezicki is the director of equine laboratory classes, and she coaches the Intercollegiate Horse Show Association (IHSA) team at the Murfreesboro, TN, university. Brzezicki got her start as a hunt seat rider in Connecticut. As a second-year undergraduate at the University of Connecticut, she and the UConn Equestrian Team won the IHSA National Championship. She then coached the UConn Equestrian Team to the National Hunt Seat Championship in 1972. In addition to competing for IHSA, Brzezicki has competed in USEF and AQHA shows. She began the MTSU Equestrian Team in 1977, and she and Kenny Copenhaver introduced the western

horsemanship divisions to IHSA that year. She would start another IHSA team, this time at Virginia Tech. She served a brief stint as Virginia Tech's IHSA coach while she attended graduate school there, but she returned to coaching at MTSU in the 1980s. Over the years, Brzezicki has coached many youth, amateur, and IHSA national champions. In addition, her background also includes teaching at 4-H horse camps in Connecticut and Tennessee. In addition, Brzezicki has been an active member of the IHSA Board of Directors, AQHA, and a big supporter of 4-H. She was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award from IHSA in 2003 and IHSA Regional Coach of the Year in 2004. Brzezicki is a CHA Master Instructor and as a CHA Assistant Clinic Instructor, she has recently begun hosting CHA Certification Clinics and thoroughly enjoys working with other teachers in an atmosphere of shared enthusiasm, knowledge, and techniques.
