Find a Riding Instructor Certification Clinic Near You

– Teaching horseback riding this summer and want to have a national association behind you? The Certified Horsemanship Association has over 100 program member equine facilities across North America that host CHA certification clinics. To find one in your area visit <http://www.CHA-ahse.org/bylocation.php>

Most CHA certification clinics take place in May and June. Find the one you want to attend and contact the host site directly to enroll. Most of them are five days in length and once an instructor is certified there is no need to attend another clinic, the instructor just has to recertify by turning in 25 hours of continuing education credit, such as attending a nutrition talk at a local feed store, attending an equine trade show, attending horsemanship clinics, etc.

As certification clinics are added to the CHA website daily, think about signing up for the CHA free monthly eblasts at www.CHA-ahse.org right on the home page. This complimentary educational monthly e-newsletter contains articles from equine lawyers, vets, trainers and instructors on a variety of topics and will list CHA news including all upcoming certification clinics.
